


Ahoy Me Hearties

'Ere be extra ideas for you to plunder!

<p>Look at pictures of different Jolly Rogers (pirate flags) and design one of your own</p> 	<p>Design a pirate outfit for a pirate man or woman</p> 	<p>Make a treasure chest out of a shoe box (or similar size box). <p>Design a treasure hunt around the house – you could use everyday objects or maybe some treats. Wailing Woods, Desert of Despair, Skeleton Swamp, Piranha Lagoon – see if you can make up your own</p> 	
<p>Decorate a triangular piece of cloth (ask your parents/carers for an old T-shirt or pillow case) to make your own bandanna</p> 	<p>Make a pirate picnic. You could include the following: Buccaneer butties, cutthroat cookies and scurvy-busting fruit salad or try some of these ideas from Top Party Ideas: Pirate Food</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Canon Balls = Round cheese balls • Polly Crackers = Cheese Ritz crackers • Octopus = Hotdogs with octopus arms cut up • Fish Bait = Swedish Fish Candy • Quick Sand Dip = Hummus • Golden Nuggets = Chicken nuggets • Pirate Teeth = Popcorn • Catch of the Day = Fish crackers • Sword Kebabs = Fruit on a stick (or any meat or veg) 	<p>Ask your parent/carer for an old duvet cover or blanket; make a pirate den and enjoy your pirate picnic – perhaps you could invent some pirate games to play – eg pirate pairs (make two pictures each of pirate paraphernalia eg. a pair of golden doubloons; a pair of pirate hats; a pair of pirate flags; a pair of pirate ships etc. They need to be on cards/paper that is the same size. Turn them over, mix them up and put them in a grid. Take it in turns to turn over two at a time. If you get a pair, you can keep it. If not, turn them back and it's the turn of the next person. Whoever gets the most pairs is the winner!</p>
