Headteacher news


I hope this newsletter finds you all well.

myHappymind Parent App Introduction - England & Wales



We have continued to use a program to all year groups at school called myHappymind. myHappymind is all based around helping children to understand how their brain works and to support them in developing positive skills and habits to be their very best selves!

myHappymind is delivered in schools by class teachers through a series of interactive lessons and then the children apply these learnings throughout the day.

To further embed this learning, myHappymind has developed a Parent App. These resources can be accessed online on your computer, or through an app on your phone. The Parent App will support you as a parent in understanding what your child is learning, activities for you to do together at home and also a Kids Zone featuring myHappymind Games plus much more!

Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/free-school-meals/?page=3

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.

Autumn Disco Thursday 17th October 2024

Dear parents / carers,

The 2024 Autumn Disco is held at school on Thursday 17th October.

Children in infants will be able to enter at 6.00pm, together with their siblings. All other children (Year 3 upwards) should arrive at 6.30pm. This allows the younger children time to settle in before the older children arrive. Children will need to be collected by a responsible adult by 8pm. The price is £2 per child.

If you would like to volunteer to help at the disco, please leave your name at the school reception or contact the PTA through the Facebook page. A list of volunteers will be made prior to the disco. Volunteers should arrive at the school office at 5.45pm and entrance is free. We will not be accepting volunteers on the night.

There'll be a DJ in the Hall, games, crafts and refreshments including hot dogs, drinks, crisps and sweets to purchase.

Face painting and temporary tattoos are available on the night. Please let a member of the PTA know, prior to the disco, if there are any concerns about this for your child for example a previous allergic reaction. Please note the tattoos are easily removed with baby oil and face paints with soop and water and should be removed before school the next day. Prices range from 20p to £1.00, and all stall holders are happy to help children who are not confident with money.

Only children that currently attend St. Paul's are allowed in the Disco. We realise this may cause inconvenience for some parents with younger children, however it is a rule for the safety of our children.

For safeguarding reasons, there are strictly no mobile phones or any electronic recording devices allowed at the disco (children or adults). We will have to ask you to leave if this rule is ignored.

For health and safety reasons we have made some changes to previous discos:

Due to fire safety regulations on the number of people allowed in the building, we ask that only parents/carers of children with medical needs stay at the disco. Parents and carers who stay will need to sign in at the school office. All children will be supervised by several St Pati's staff and PTA volunteers. Staff will contact parents/carers if their child wishes to leave early.

We are also changing where to collect children from at the end of the disco. Children in infants can be collected at 7.45pm from their own classroom doors, apart from children in Alders class. <u>Alders</u> pupils can be collected from Berries classroom door. Juniors can be collected from the external hald doors at 8pm. Please contact school to let them know if your child is being collected by someone else.



You must apply even if you have siblings at your preferred school or academy.

Attendance/Holiday information

Attendance to school is compulsory, all children must attend every day unless they are ill.

To enable us to safeguard our children, may we request that if your child is absent from school you, please telephone the school on 01706 215893 by 09:00am to inform us. If we have not received a call, a member of our office staff will call you to ensure that your child is at home and is safe.

What to do if my child is ill.

Despite school being cleaned daily using antibacterial solutions with the use of antibacterial soap and hand gels available for all to use freely. It is that time of year where Illness and viruses start to unfold.

- The NHS have a helpful guide should you wish to use this. <u>Is my child too ill for school? NHS</u> (www.nhs.uk)
- Please can you ensure that your child does not attend school for 48 hours after they have last vomited or had diarrhoea.

We are still encouraging good respiratory hygiene i.e. covering their nose/mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, discarding tissues after use and washing hands with soap and water. It is important to reduce the risk to others.

Can you authorise my child's absence?

As many of you are aware, we are unable to authorise any absences that are not illness related unless in exceptional circumstances. There is a 'leave of absence' form available from the school office however, we would ask that all holidays are taken within the holiday periods and not in term time, to avoid a fine from Lancashire County Council.

Important Update – Changes to Education-related Penalty Notices from September 2024

Information for Parents



You may be aware that the Department for Education announced national changes to penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence in term time. These changes will come into effect on 19 August 2024.

The changes to be aware of are:

Please note that school does not receive any money for penalty notices.

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- A second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.

- The threshold at which a penalty notice **must** be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period[1]. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
- This also includes pupils with persistent absences.
- Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.

Absences can have a lasting effect on learning

Missing a week of school means your child will miss around 25 hours of learning
This creates gaps in their knowledge and could mean they will not meet their full potential

[1] A school week is any week in which a school meets at least once.



Wonderful Willows



Willows Class always work hard but this week they have worked exceptionally hard and made us very proud!

In English we have been writing our own fantasy stories, based upon the Nowhere Emporium. We had a huge list of steps of success for these lessons and the children have done so well, including dialogue, relative clauses, 'ing' openers, expanded noun phrases and similes. We have written so much each day that we have had to do finger yoga midway through our sessions! We will be finishing our stories next week and we can't wait to see the finished stories!

In Maths we have begun our Statistics unit and the children have had to tackle the tricky concepts of discrete and continuous data. They have studied a range of graphs and interpreted and calculated the data from them. Great work Willows!

In History we have continued to look at the Vikings as raiders and investigate how they were so successful at travelling such long distances before the invention of modern ships and aeroplanes. We studied why monasteries were a target for the initial raids and how the the capacity of different longboats gives us clues as to whether they were used for raiding, trading or as cargo ships.
