Headteacher news


Happy New Year to all. I hope you have had a wonderful break and have many memories to treasure. It has been lovely to have everybody back together in school this week including all our new families who have joined us.

This half term is one of my favourites, the evenings get lighter, and everything starts to grow including our children. With this in mind we will all be learning about our brain this half term. How we can look after it and make it grow. How we can keep it regulated and understand how we build neuroplasticity when we are learning. We will be learning about this through a program called My Happy Mind. myHappymind is an award winning, whole school curriculum. It teaches children preventative habits that support positive mental health, resilience and self-esteem.

It will be taught to every child in a school from Early Years through to Year 6, All of the concepts we teach are based in science and research and grounded in neuroscience and positive psychology. Parents can download the Myhappymind app and find out about what we have been learning and get some top tips to help parents too. More information about this has been attached to the newsletter emailed out to parents today.

Alongside this, also attached is our monthly online safety letter giving you the most up to date information of how you can keep your children safe online.

For families living in the Lancashire area who require a primary school place in September 2024, this is your last chance to apply before the deadline. You can now apply online via Lancashire's online system at:



Winter virus information



We currently have a high number of pupils and staff who have been off sick with suspected flu-like symptoms. Symptoms of influenza (flu) can include fever, an aching body, dry cough, headache, sore throat, diarrhoea or tummy pain, feeling sick and being sick. Despite school being cleaned daily using antibacterial solutions with the use of antibacterial soap and hand gels available for all to use freely. It is that time of year and many schools and people across the valley are suffering with the virus.

To reduce the spread of infection it is important to keep children with any symptoms of flu-like illness away from school until they have fully recovered, are free of symptoms and have not had a fever for at least 48 hours.

We are still encouraging good respiratory hygiene i.e. covering their nose/mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, discarding tissues after use and washing hands with soap and water. It is important to reduce the risk to others.

Apply for support for with childcare costs.



From 2 January 2024, eligible working parents can apply for 15 hours of childcare for their two-year-old. Parents have until 31 March 2024 to apply for a code, with mid-January to the end of February being the optimum time to apply in case they need to provide further information to support their application.

To apply for a childcare code each parent needs to be working and earning the equivalent of 16 hours a week at national minimum/living wage and under £100,000 adjusted net income per year. This means that each parent needs to earn from just over £8,600 per year to be eligible for 15 hours a week of childcare during term time.

There is more information on the childcare support available to parents on the <u>Childcare Choices</u> website, where they can explore the early education entitlements and other government help with childcare costs.



Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



1 - Have your circumstances changed?

For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/free-school-meals/?page=3

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.

Super Sycamores





Happy New year and welcome back to the Spring term.

This week has been busy, and we have started reading our class book - The Boy Who Grew Dragons. The children are enjoying the story and have made great predictions about what they think will happen using clues in the story. Year 4 children have been dividing using the chunking method and I am so proud how hard they have worked to understand this new concept. Year 3 children have been rounding to the nearest hundred and adding/ subtracting over the hundreds barrier.

We have also started our Science topic - living things and their habitats by grouping and classifying different animals using four different criteria. Our Geography topic is Geography in the News where we have been learning about the recent flooding in England.

Mighty Oaks




Happy New Year and welcome back! It has been a wonderful start to the new year and it has been lovely to welcome the children back after the Christmas break.




