School dinners

We would like to give you advance notice that from September 2024 the cost of a school meals is rising from £2.50 to £2.70 per meal. £13.50 per week.

Children moving from year 2 into year 3 will no longer receive the Universal free school meals and will need to pay for school lunches from September should you wish for school to continue to provide lunch.

Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



For any parents/carers, whose circumstances have changed and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:


Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.

In maths, the year 1 children have been looking at fractions and the reception children have been looking at space and positional language. This week we have been enjoying science week in Ashes. We started by looking at Mary Seacole and how she helped people as a nurse in the war. Our focus this week is to explore our bodies were we learnt about how our lungs work and made our own plastic lungs. We learnt about our muscles and how we need meat and fish to help build them, we then went to forest school to test out our muscles climbing trees. We explored what happens to food when we eat it and mixed our food and drink together in our stomach and squeezed it through the intestines to see what it looks like when it comes out. On Thursday we enjoyed the travelling science show, we got to predict, measure, observe and classify whilst learning to work scientifically. Finally on Friday we had a special visitor Dr Joy Hirst who came to speak to us about our bodies, how doctors can help us keep our bodies healthy and we explored our own teddy hospital.



The children have been learning how to use grid method this week. They haven't found it easy but have really persevered and have worked super hard. 

Important Update – Changes to Education-related Penalty Notices

Information for Parents

You may be aware that the **Department for Education** has recently announced national changes to penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence in term time. These changes will come into effect on 19 August 2024.

The changes to be aware of are:

Please note that school does not receive any money for penalty notices.

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice must be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period[1]. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
- Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.

Absences can have a lasting effect on learning

Missing a week of school means your child will miss around 25 hours of learning
This creates gaps in their knowledge and could mean they will not meet their full potential

[1] A school week is any week in which a school meets at least once.
