Possible Strike Action

As you may have heard in the press that the National Education Union (NEU) intend to carry out industrial action over the national pay offer and that their members plan to strike over a number of days in the coming months.

The dates are as follows:

Wednesday 1st February Tuesday 28th February Wednesday 15th March Thursday 16th March

I wanted to make sure that you are all aware in case you have not see the press coverage. The impact of the action will mean that you will need to consider alternative childcare arrangements on these dates. I am currently assessing the impact that this may have on our school and will inform parents of this at the earliest opportunity. Classrooms will only be closed if their teacher is a member of the NEU, and they intend to strike. This will mean we will possibly have a partial opening with some classrooms closed, whilst others remain open.

Whilst as a school we regret any inconvenience this may cause; we must respect that the members of any profession/union have the right to take this action following a legal ballot.

I will keep you informed as the situation develops before the first day of strike action on the 1^{st of} February.
