

### Headteacher news


This week our year 6 children have completed their end of year SAT's and finished the week with a celebration party. We are all very proud of each and every one of you.

### School dinners

We would like to give you advance notice that from September 2024 the cost of a school meals is rising from £2.50 to £2.70 per meal. £13.50 per week.

Children moving from year 2 into year 3 will no longer receive the Universal free school meals and will need to pay for school lunches from September should you wish for school to continue to provide lunch.

## Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



For any parents/carers, whose circumstances have changed and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.

### Marvellous Maples



This week in our English lessons, Maples have been gripped by our class reader The Raven Boy and the adventures of the main character. We have left the story on a cliff hanger; where the main character has seen the Fire of London and realised his sister is right in the middle of it. He has just set off to see if he can find her and the book describes the fire and surroundings using ambitious vocabulary which creates a great discussion.

In DT lessons, we have begun designing our own lights linked to our Science topic of electrical circuits. measurements. The Year 5's have been choosing an appropriate strategy for addition and subtraction. In Art, the children have been learning about Greek pottery and looking at and drawing the different geometric patterns. At forest school this week, the children investigated how well the parachutes they had made worked. Each group investigated different questions they had devised such as: which material works best for a parachute?

### Mighty Oaks









To enable us to safeguard our children, may we request that if your child is absent from school you, please telephone the school on 01706 215893 by 09:00am to inform us. If we have not received a call, a member of our office staff will call you to ensure that your child is at home and is safe.

# Important Update - Changes to Education-related Penalty Notices

### Information for Parents

You may be aware that the **Department for Education** has recently announced national changes to penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence in term time. These changes will come into effect on 19 August 2024.

The changes to be aware of are:

Please note that school does not receive any money for penalty notices.

• Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.

- Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice must be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period[1]. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
- Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.

### Absences can have a lasting effect on learning

Missing a week of school means your child will miss around 25 hours of learning This creates gaps in their knowledge and could mean they will not meet their full potential


