



England Rocks times tables competition

As part of our commitment to make maths exciting and high profile in our school, the Junior children are taking part in a friendly competition involving schools in England. The competition runs from 07:30 GMT Tuesday 14th November 2023 to 19:30 GMT Thursday 16th November 2023. It's all done online via play.ttrockstars.com.

Children can play in any gamemode with every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, earning themselves, their class and the school a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours, subject to a daily 60-minute limit (see below). Winning classes in the school and in the competition as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

To support player wellbeing, there is a daily time limit of 60-minutes per player. In other words, each player can earn competition points for up to 60-minutes between 07:30 GMT and 19:30 GMT on 07:30 GMT Tuesday 14th November 2023 to 19:30 GMT Thursday 16th November 2023. Once the player goes beyond 60-minutes of play on that day, they will still earn coins but will no longer earn points towards the competition.

In the spirit of the competition, please don't play on their behalf but by all means encourage and support them as much as you can.

Amazing Acorns

The children have returned to school really excited for their new learning this half term.

This week we have learnt about continents and oceans of the world. We have been counting in groups of 2 and 5 in maths and have started to read 'Jack and the baked beanstalk' in English.

Alders have had a great week. In English we have started our new book Little Red Riding Hood was Rotten, we have enjoyed reading the start of the story from the Wolf's point of view. In math's we have been doubling and looking at multiplication as arrays. In history we started our new topic and are excited to find out more about Rosa Parks and why she is a significant person in history.

This week we have also started practicing our nativity songs and leering our lines. Please practice at home with your children if they have brought a script home.

This week we have started subtracting using column method. We have been looking at Skara Brae and how it is was essential to finding out what life was like in the Neolithic period.

Marvellous Maples



This week in Maples class we have started reading The Firework Maker's Daughter as part of our English and Guided Reading lessons. The children are already engaged in this adventure story and eager to find out what happens to the main character. Thank you to all the parents who have provided a copy of the book.

On Thursday, the children enjoyed taking part in the Health and Well Being day with Edge Hill. The class have loved completing all the activities and now have their watch to wear for the week. Sleeping logs have also been sent home. Please return on the 10th November - thank you for all your support.

Dazzling Elders



This week the children have been making observations in Science. They set up an experiment before the holiday to separate a salt water solution. The children were very interested to discover that the water had evaporated leaving behind the salt which had formed tiny cubes. In Geography the children have been learning about Ordnance Survey Symbols and what they represent. At Forest School this week the children learned about the different poppies and their meanings and wove poppies using sticks that they had found. The children are really enjoying the new novel The Boy at The Back of the Class thank you to all the parents who have provided a copy for their child. The children are really engaged and can't wait to find out who Ahmet is.

Reminder: Please can all children have appropriate forest school kit in school, as many were missing wellies or waterproofs and we go to forest school in all weathers.

Wonderful Willows



This week at Forest school, inspired by Elders we attempted to make a poppy using sticks, wool and a number of knot techniques. In class, we discussed the different coloured poppies and what they symbolise on Remembrance day to help us to choose which we would like to replicate. After this, due to the rainy weather we took to the mud slide to embrace the great outdoors whilst half of the class choose to reenact a Viking battle.

Please ensure you check the Newsletter or our classroom window for Forest School dates, it is really important the children are dressed appropriately for the weather.


Mighty Oaks



Oaks class this week have been looking at war poetry and the effects of imagery on the reader. In maths, we have been working on written division methods using our chunking. It has certainly tested our perseverance and times tables knowledge this week!!

Next week is Bikeability - please remember to bring bikes and helmets to school on the days of your sessions. Group 1 is on Monday and Tuesday; Group 2 is on Wednesday and Thursday. If your child is in Group 1, swimming kits will not be needed on Monday. Don't forget, children need to wrap up warm with plenty of layers and to make sure they have a waterproof coat with them.
