- Optional- school hoodie/ school jumper



Attendance/Holiday information

Attendance to school is compulsory, all children must attend every day unless they are ill.

To enable us to safeguard our children, may we request that if your child is absent from school you, please telephone the school on 01706 215893 by 09:00am to inform us. If we have not received a call, a member of our office staff will call you to ensure that your child is at home and is safe.

What to do if my child is ill.

Despite school being cleaned daily using antibacterial solutions with the use of antibacterial soap and hand gels available for all to use freely. It is that time of year where Illness and viruses start to unfold.

- The NHS have a helpful guide should you wish to use this. <u>Is my child too ill for school? -</u> <u>NHS (www.nhs.uk)</u>
- Please can you ensure that your child does not attend school for 48 hours after they have last vomited or had diarrhoea.

We are still encouraging good respiratory hygiene i.e. covering their nose/mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, discarding tissues after use and washing hands with soap and water. It is important to reduce the risk to others.

Can you authorise my child's absence?

As many of you are aware, we are unable to authorise any absences that are not illness related unless in exceptional circumstances. There is a 'leave of absence' form available from the school office however, we would ask that all holidays are taken within the holiday periods and not in term time, to avoid a fine from Lancashire County Council.

You should now have received our new holiday dates for the 2025-26 school year. These dates are crucial for planning purposes, and I kindly ask that you keep them in mind when considering any future family holidays or trips.

It's worth reiterating our school's policy on attendance during term time. As you're all aware, we place a high value on consistent attendance and its impact on our pupils' educational progress. With this in mind, I must remind you that leave during term time will not be authorised. This policy is in place to ensure that our pupils receive the full benefit of their education and don't miss out on valuable learning opportunities.

Should unauthorised leave be taken during term time, it's important to note that this will result in a penalty notice. This measure is not one we take lightly, but it's necessary to maintain the high standards of attendance that contribute to our pupils' success.

I understand that planning family time is important, and I hope that by providing these dates well in advance, we can work together to ensure that holidays and family commitments align with the school calendar wherever possible.



In English, we have been continuing with Dear Zoo. This week we have been writing about why each animal was sent back. We have been working hard to use finger spaces and full stops. In phonics we have been recapping the early phase 3 digraphs and tricky words. Phonics Play is a great resource to support with this at home.

In maths we have been learning all about doubling and halving. Ask your child if they can remember any double facts.

In science we have been looking at different animals and their habitats. We have been thinking about why they live in different environments.

In forest school, we were exploring the environment for signs of spring. We spotted lots of daffodils and mini beasts. We were even lucky enough to see lots of frogs had appeared in our pond. The children were very intrigued to observe how they moved and communicated to each other.

Curriculum news

In English, we have been reading 'The Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen and writing our adjectives to describe each setting. The children next week will be creating their own stories based on this wonderful book.

In Maths the children in Year 1 have been working hard on fractions- finding ½ and ¼ of shapes and small amounts. We have been sorting odd and even numbers in our fluency sessions.

In topic, we have been making chassis and axles with wheels to create our vehicles. **Please** could your child bring in some junk modelling items to help with their final design- tissue boxes, kitchen roll tubes will work best!

This week in history the children were detectives and had to find out why 52 bodies were killed at the Maiden Castle Hillfort. They read sources and looked at pictures to find out what happened and why?

In English we have been continuing our novel 'Escape from Pompeii'. The children summarised the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. The children watched a reenactment about what happened to Pompeii. They thought about their senses for what it might have been like for the people of Pompeii. The children have written a setting description of what Pompeii was like after the eruption.

In maths we continued with fractions to add and subtract fractions to and from one whole and add fractions within one whole.

In R.E this week, the children thought about the duties they have to do themselves, to the family and to the community. They came up with some amazing ideas. We are very proud of them.

Another busy week in Elders!

This week the children have been comparing life in Anglo Saxon times with life now. They read about life in the village and looked at pictures of Anglo-Saxon houses. The children made lots of interesting observations and comparisons.

In English, we have been continuing reading our novel 'Beowulf. The children have been writing character descriptions of the monster Grendel and have used descriptive language including similes and expanded noun phrases.

In Maths this week we have continued solving multiplication problems and practising recall of times tables.

With only two weeks left until the end of the Spring term, Oaks class continue to work hard in all the different activities that they have faced. It was lovely to speak to so many parents this week at our Parents Evenings. Thank you for taking the time to come into school and discuss your child's progress.

Curriculum news

In English, we are starting to put together ideas for writing our own narrative using a flashback. The children have selected characters within the story to create a back story about them. We have been using techniques to build tension and identified signposts to signal a shift in time. Ratio has been our focus in maths and we have been scaling up and down using our knowledge of multiplication. We have identified different representations and have been introduced to the ratio symbol.

Zaha Hadid is our artist we have been looking at this half term in our art lessons. Using her architectural designs as inspiration, the children have designed their own buildings drawing these in different formations. Once the finishing touches have been applied, we are looking forward to displaying our work in school for everyone to see.

Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

<u>https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/free-school-</u> meals/?page=3

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.
