
Unfortunately, we are having to postpone or cancel the following events. Further information will follow within this newsletter.

From Monday our Infant gates will be locked at 3.15pm to enable staff to set up learning and provision for the following day. Please can we remind all parents that all activities that are out on the playground have been set up specifically for a learning task. Please can you encourage your children not to play with these when at drop and collection. We understand that for our children it is exciting to find and play

with something they have not seen before so we would be very grateful for your support with this would be very much appreciated.

Important virus information



We currently have a high number of pupils and staff who have been off sick with suspected flu-like symptoms. Symptoms of influenza (flu) can include fever, an aching body, dry cough, headache, sore throat, diarrhoea, or tummy pain, feeling sick and being sick. Despite school being cleaned daily using antibacterial solutions with the use of antibacterial soap and hand gels available for all to use freely. It is that time of year and many schools and people across the valley are suffering with many viruses.

- Due to the high number of children and staff that are currently unwell with viruses and whooping cough. Please can you ensure that your child does not attend school for 48 hours after they have last vomited or had diarrhoea.
- If your child is diagnosed with Whooping cough, please ensure that they do not attend until 48 hours after they have started treatment with antibiotics. Anyone diagnosed with Whooping cough or Pertussis as it is medically known as, will be excluded from school for 21 days should they not be treated with antibiotics. This is a public health requirement to ensure the safety of everyone due to the rapid spread of the disease.
- Symptoms include severe headache, temperature, aching, lethargic, sickness/diarrhoea.
 Children will need to rest and drink plenty of fluids. Always seek advice from your doctor.

We are still encouraging good respiratory hygiene i.e. covering their nose/mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, discarding tissues after use and washing hands with soap and water. It is important to reduce the risk to others.

We are looking forward to welcoming you all into school for our Spring term Parents' Evening which will take place on **Tuesday 23rd April and Thursday 25th April.** for all classes. These meetings will take place in school.

The purpose of this Parents' Evening is to discuss your child's progress this academic year including social and emotional progress. The appointment system allows **5 minutes** for each meeting, and we ask in consideration of others, that you do not exceed this time. We urge you not to leave any concerns you may have or issues you may want to discuss until Parents' Evening. Please make a separate appointment on another day to allow us to give you the time needed.

Mrs Horrocks (Inclusion Manager) or Mrs Ormerod (Deputy Head) will also be available for anyone who wishes to seek any advice or support for their children. Appointments can be made through the school office. If you require another copy of the letter, please ask at the school office.

Apply for support for with childcare costs.



From 2 January 2024, eligible working parents can apply for 15 hours of childcare for their two-year-old. Parents have until 31 March 2024 to apply for a code, with mid-January to the end of February being the optimum time to apply in case they need to provide further information to support their application.

To apply for a childcare code each parent needs to be working and earning the equivalent of 16 hours a week at national minimum/living wage and under £100,000 adjusted net income per year. This means that each parent needs to earn from just over £8,600 per year to be eligible for 15 hours a week of childcare during term time.

There is more information on the childcare support available to parents on the <u>Childcare Choices</u> website, where they can explore the early education entitlements and other government help with childcare costs.

Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



1 - Have your circumstances changed?

For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.

Super Sycamores




This week Sycamores have innovated their poems about Buckingham Palace. We have written, rehearsed and performed them to another class! Super ideas Sycamores!

Thank you for your understanding regarding Maples trip postponement and I will let you know the new date as soon as possible.

In Science, we have continued to learn about electric circuits and made predictions about what materials would be good conductors or if they would be insulators. We have tested these items and discovered that most metals are good conductors. We also found out that lead in a pencil is a conductor, but it does not work as well as metals.

In English, we have started our setting descriptions and I am amazed at the vocabulary the children are using to describe the Place Between. These words include amethyst, luminous, indigo and twinkling.

Mighty Oaks




This week, as we edge ever closer to the end of term, the children have been working hard in all subject areas.
