Apply for support for with childcare costs.



From 2 January 2024, eligible working parents can apply for 15 hours of childcare for their two-year-old. Parents have until 31 March 2024 to apply for a code, with mid-January to the end of February being the optimum time to apply in case they need to provide further information to support their application.

To apply for a childcare code each parent needs to be working and earning the equivalent of 16 hours a week at national minimum/living wage and under £100,000 adjusted net income per year. This means that each parent needs to earn from just over £8,600 per year to be eligible for 15 hours a week of childcare during term time.

There is more information on the childcare support available to parents on the <u>Childcare Choices</u> website, where they can explore the early education entitlements and other government help with childcare costs.

Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



1 - Have your circumstances changed?

For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.

February Disco Thursday 8th February 2024

Dear parents / carers

The 2024 February Disco is held at school on **Thursday 8**th **February.**

The doors open for all children at **6.00pm** and **ALL** children need to be collected from school **by 8.00pm** by a responsible adult.

Please note that only children that currently attend St. Paul's are allowed in the Disco. We realise this may cause inconvenience for some parents with younger children, however it is a rule for the safety of our children.

The price is £2 per child. If you wish to stay with your child at the Disco, then the cost per adult is £2.00. Please note that adults do not need to stay as the children will be supervised by staff and PTA volunteers. Adults who stay cannot use their mobile phones during the disco. This is a strict rule for safeguarding reasons. We will have to ask you to leave if this rule is ignored.

A list of volunteers will be made prior to the disco and volunteers should arrive at 5.45pm and entrance is free. Please leave your name at the school reception or contact the PTA through the Facebook page. We will not be accepting volunteers on the night.

As well as the Disco, where the children can boogie in their best dresses or party pants, there are other activities such as lucky dip, crafts and games. Refreshments in the form of hot dogs are available to buy plus juice, water, crisps and sweets. Face painting and temporary tattoos are also available on the night. Please note the tattoos are easily removed with baby oil. Prices range from 20p to £1.00, and all stall holders are happy to help children who are not confident with money.

The children have a wonderful time and grow in confidence with each school Disco, however if you have any concerns please seek out a member of the PTA or ask at reception.

Awesome Ashes



It has been lovely to welcome you all back into school this week and hear about what you got up to in the holidays. We have started our new English topic on the classic story 'We are going on a bear hunt' by Michael Rosen. We have made predictions about what we think might happen in the story and the we wrote/ asked questions to the author. In Maths Year 1 have been looking at place value and adding/ taking away 10 and the reception children have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes. Finally we have started our new science topic on animals. We had to classify animals into lots of different categories based on what they look like and what we knew about the animals already.

This week, Sycamores have learnt about the history of New Hall Hey Mill and Whittaker Park in our History topic- a very interesting story to ask your child about! In Maths, we have learnt about halving shapes and numbers. We developed our fluency on even numbers and counting in groups of 2.In English, we have started to look at non chronological reports- this will lead up to writing a report about the mills in Rawtenstall later next week.

We loved Kids Rock coming in to teach music and our Sports Coach teaching our athletics this week.

Outstanding Alders



A super first week back for Outstanding Alders! In English we have started our new book Man on the Moon. We are really enjoying learning more about Bob's daily life. We have explored the start of Bob's day and are looking forward to finding out more about Bob and the moon. At forest school we enjoyed playing on the mud slide and also making a start on our display for our English working wall. In RE we discuss the importance of the Easter story and the reason we have Easter eggs and hot cross buns and what they represent in the Easter story. On Tuesday we also had a kid's rock session, we loved getting to sing and dance and use different instruments to make music.

In maths we have continued with grid method using problems to embed their understanding of the multiplication. Just a gentle reminder in year 3 the children should be learning there 3, 4, 8. They can do this by going on TTRS or the game we use within class called hit the button.






































Reflective Friday
