

# This week we have been learning...

#### **Amazing Acorns**



In Acorns this week we have been exploring the number 8, we are now experts. We have been writing it and making number pairs using the Numicon.

In English we have continued thinking about the farmer and we have been writing sentences to describe him.

We have been thinking about where we live and exploring our school grounds. We have been using a map for our school playground and marking where we have found coloured cones.

We also went to forest school and made some fabulous self-portraits.

#### **Brilliant Berries**

In Berries this week, we have been continuing to explore Lost and found and enjoyed dressing up as the characters. In maths, the reception children have been exploring number 8 and year 1s have been finding quarters. In DT we have been making structures. We particularly enjoyed using marshmallows to make an igloo for our penguin.

#### Awesome Ashes



This week Ashes went to forest school to test out our teddy zipline. We used different materials to predict and investigate which would be the best material to carry the teddy down the zipline. We reviewed each of the materials and rated if it was good to use or not. Some of us even managed to say why we thought it was a good zipline material or why it wasn't.


#### **Super Sycamores**



This week, we have been reading and responding to our new story- Prince Cinders. We have predicted, created story maps and matched adjectives to characters. In Maths we've been learning about money.

Why not encourage your child to play 'guess the coin' or order the coins in value? We are busy getting ready for our Nativity. This week we had our first practice on the stage. We really enjoyed seeing the other classes doing their parts and enjoyed singing and dancing.

#### **Outstanding Alders**



In Alders this week, we have been busy writing our own alternative versions of Red Riding Hood. We have really enjoyed exploring the characters different point of view. In maths we have moved on to learning about capacity and how we measure this.

We are busy getting ready for our Nativity. This week we had our first practice on the stage. We really enjoyed seeing the other classes doing their parts and how that fits within the play.

#### **Enchanted Elms**



This week in English this week the children have authored their own non-chronological reports about the Stone Age. They have all done a fabulous job and I am so proud of them.

In Maths we have started looking at multiplication - drawing arrays for the calculations and solving problems relating to arrays. The children have also been learning about the human skeleton and the skeletons of other animals - finding similarities and differences.

#### Marvellous Maples



On Monday, as part of our learning in Geography, Maples class went on a fieldtrip to support our learning about Rivers. The children were amazing on the walk and learnt about the distinctive features of rivers and how rivers join which makes the water flow change. We were extremely excited to see a Heron when it took off, the children watched as the heron followed the river upstream.

#### **Dazzling Elders**



In Elders this week, we have been writing non chronological style using formal language and third person. The year four children have been working on division in maths using chunking. The year fives have been mastering column subtraction involving exchanging. All the children have worked really hard.

In PSHE, the children have been discussing how to manage conflict and make compromises.

#### Wonderful Willows



Willows have done some amazing English work this week investigating the character of Scrooge in 'A Christmas Carol'. We have thought of questions we would like to ask him, used role play to develop an understanding of his character and analysed the figurative language that Dickens uses to describe him. We have written our own character descriptions of him using what we have learnt.

In Art, we have continued our work on Hundertwasser, looking at his love of 'the phenomenal spiral' and how it influenced his artwork. We have had a go at creating our own spiral based art and have investigated spirals within the natural world.



1 - In Oaks this week, we have been extending our learning of World War Two and have been finding out about the life of Anne Frank. The children have demonstrated great empathy and asked many thought provoking questions about her. We are now using all this information to write her biography.

#### **Budding Blossoms**



Blossoms' have had a wonderful week this week, we are continuing our division unit and getting really stuck in. We love using the equipment to solve our problems, some children have been using cupcakes and gems to solve the questions. We have been using the chunking method for bigger questions too. In English, we are continuing with our story, 'The True Story of the 3 Little Pigs' and we have started to look at following instructions. The children were very frustrated when I gave them terrible instructions to make a paper aeroplane but were happy when we used a video that showed and make excellent examples.

Books are changed every Tuesday and Friday, and we encourage you to read daily to develop the children's fluency skills.

# Every little helps...

Lancashire libraries are helping tackle digital poverty as part of the National Databank scheme.

The National Databank provides free SIM cards from Virgin Media O2, Vodafone and Three.

The SIM cards have mobile data, minutes and text. This scheme works with Good Things Foundation's network of local community partners including our libraries.

You can qualify for data from your local library if you are over 18, are from a low-income household, and:

- have no access or insufficient access to the internet at home
- have no or insufficient access to the internet when away from home
- cannot afford your existing monthly contract or top up

To benefit from the scheme, a recipient's device must either be unlocked or, if locked, be locked to O2, Vodafone or Three.

Ask about the scheme at your <u>local library</u>.

You will need to make an appointment at the library to collect the SIM card.
