School dinners

We would like to give you advance notice that from September 2024 the cost of a school meals is rising from £2.50 to £2.70 per meal. £13.50 per week.

Children moving from year 2 into year 3 will no longer receive the Universal free school meals and will need to pay for school lunches from September should you wish for school to continue to provide lunch.

Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.

On Monday we had a lovely joint trip with Berries to the Sealife centre Manchester. All the children should be so proud of themselves for how brilliantly they represented St Pauls with their manners, behaviour and attitude. The children loved bringing our knowledge of habitats and animals together as well as learning about new sea creatures we had never heard off.

This week we have been looking at innovating the two little dicky birds rhyme to create our own. In maths the reception children have been learning how to partition numbers and we have been starting to write our own number sentences using numbers and pictorial representations. The Year 1 children have been looking at halving amounts beyond 20 using practical resources, we will continue this into next week.

In science we started our new topic on Seasonal Changes. We have created seasonal artwork and been observing scientists down in forest school looking for new signs of spring.

I would just like to say a huge well done to all of Maples class for their behaviour and learning on our trip on Thursday to the Whitaker. Whilst at the museum we learnt lots about the history of Rawtenstall as well as handling artifacts linked to the cotton mills and then we played detectives whilst in the room of curiosities. After lunch, we managed a quick play of the grass before heading to Ilex Mill and the Weavers Cottage where we made links with our class learning. Elders, it was lovely to meet up with so many parents this week at Parent's Evening to share your children's achievements with you all.

We've had another busy and productive week. In English the children have been gathering ideas and examining the structure of myths to begin to plan their own.

In Maths the Year 5's have been continuing with place value up to three decimal places and have been ordering numbers, rounding to the nearest whole number or integer and exploring negative numbers. The Year 4's have been looking at the properties of shapes including triangles and quadrilaterals.

The children enjoyed their swimming lesson at Marl Pits. They are now organised into groups. These groups were organised by the swimming teachers based on their initial observations but as they get to know the children there will be movement between the groups and as the children progress.

Attendance/Holiday information

Attendance to school is compulsory, all children must attend every day unless they are ill or have symptoms of Covid, Whooping Cough or Measels.

We are unable to authorise any absences that are not illness related unless in exceptional circumstances. There is a leave of absence form available from the school office however, we would ask that all holidays are taken within the holiday periods and not in term time, to avoid a fine from Lancashire County Council. To enable us to safeguard our children, may we request that if your child is absent from school you, please telephone the school on 01706 215893 by 09:00am to inform us. If we have not received a call, a member of our office staff will call you to ensure that your child is at home and is safe.

Important Update – Changes to Education-related Penalty Notices

Information for Parents

You may be aware that the **Department for Education** has recently announced national changes to penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence in term time. These changes will come into effect on 19 August 2024.

The changes to be aware of are:

Please note that school does not receive any money for penalty notices.

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice **must** be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period[1]. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
- Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.

Absences can have a lasting effect on learning

Missing a week of school means your child will miss around 25 hours of learning This creates gaps in their knowledge and could mean they will not meet their full potential

[1] A school week is any week in which a school meets at least once.
