

Attendance/Holiday information

Attendance to school is compulsory, all children must attend every day unless they are ill.

To enable us to safeguard our children, may we request that if your child is absent from school you, please telephone the school on 01706 215893 by 09:00am to inform us. If we have not received a call, a member of our office staff will call you to ensure that your child is at home and is safe.

What to do if my child is ill.

Despite school being cleaned daily using antibacterial solutions with the use of antibacterial soap and hand gels available for all to use freely. It is that time of year where Illness and viruses start to unfold.

- The NHS have a helpful guide should you wish to use this. <u>Is my child too ill for school? NHS (www.nhs.uk)</u>
- Please can you ensure that your child does not attend school for 48 hours after they have last vomited or had diarrhoea.

We are still encouraging good respiratory hygiene i.e. covering their nose/mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, discarding tissues after use and washing hands with soap and water. It is important to reduce the risk to others.

Can you authorise my child's absence?

As many of you are aware, we are unable to authorise any absences that are not illness related unless in exceptional circumstances. There is a 'leave of absence' form available from the school office however, we would ask that all holidays are taken within the holiday periods and not in term time, to avoid a fine from Lancashire County Council.

You should now have received our new holiday dates for the 2025-26 school year. These dates are crucial for planning purposes, and I kindly ask that you keep them in mind when considering any future family holidays or trips.

It's worth reiterating our school's policy on attendance during term time. As you're all aware, we place a high value on consistent attendance and its impact on our pupils' educational progress. With this in mind, I must remind you that leave during term time will not be authorised. This policy is in place to ensure that our pupils receive the full benefit of their education and don't miss out on valuable learning opportunities.

Should unauthorised leave be taken during term time, it's important to note that this will result in a penalty notice. This measure is not one we take lightly, but it's necessary to maintain the high standards of attendance that contribute to our pupils' success.

I understand that planning family time is important, and I hope that by providing these dates well in advance, we can work together to ensure that holidays and family commitments align with the school calendar wherever possible.

This week we have been learning...



Brilliant Berries

Wow! What a fantastic week we have had in Berries! The children have come back refreshed and raring to go, we have been so busy.

In English, we have started our new text, 'What the Ladybird Heard' by Julia Donaldson. The children are really enjoying it and have already written some fantastic descriptions for the ladybird! We are super proud of their writing!

In phonics, we have been recapping all the different digraphs that we have learnt so far and improving our segmenting and blending skills with these sounds. It's been fabulous to see the children use them in their writing too.

In maths, we have been looking at money and being able to make amounts using coins. We've enjoyed having a toy shop and buying different toys with what coins we have. We have picked this up really quickly and the children are money wizards already. I'm sure they can help you out when shopping now.

In our topic lessons this week, we have been completing our science lessons. We have looked at the life cycle of a butterfly and a frog! We have enjoyed creating the butterflies life cycle with play dough and then we have written sentences about each stage. We have been blown away by their efforts and how hard the children have worked on these tasks. Well done Berries!

Next week, we have forest school. Please ensure they have their kits in school and as always on Monday we have PE with Dan, our sports coach, children can attend school in their PE kits.

We also have World Book Day on Thursday 6th March, I am sure the children are excited to be part of our vocabulary parade, I can't wait to see what you all come up with. Please ensure they are still wearing appropriate footwear.

Curriculum News

We have continued working on our story 'The Highway Rat'. The children have been stepping into the magic mirror and transforming into the characters. We have been writing diary entries as characters from the story.

In maths we have been working on money, we have had to exchange coins, give change and work out exactly how much two items would cost together. Should you like to have a go at home, here is a great game that you can play:

Enchanted Elms



What a super start to the new half term!

In English, we have started our new novel 'Escape from Pompeii' by Christina Balit. The novel is about the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in AD 79 which meant death for most of the Roman citizens living in Pompeii. But some people must have survived, and Christina Balit has used this as the starting point for her story.

It tells of Tranio, an actor's son, and his friend Livia, the baker's daughter, who witness the destruction of their beloved city. This text will engage the children of historical fiction and links with topics of ancient Rome and natural disasters. Set against the backdrop of the eruption of Vesuvius in AD 79, it helps bring the topic to life and provides children with a rich background knowledge of a significant historical period.

In maths, we have been learning about shapes – this week the children learnt two new words 'perpendicular and parallel'. They are extremely tricky concepts to learn the children tried very hard with these. On Wednesday, we recognised the work of The Refugee Crisis Foundation and dressed in blue to raise money and awareness of the plight of refugees. We read a book called 'Tomorrow' by Nadine Kaadan. Linked to this, we did a PSHE lesson on feelings about the book. We looked back at Yazan's expressions on different pages of the story and talked together about how he is feeling. Yazan's experience living in a war zone has some similarities to life during the 2020 Pandemic. We discussed what is the same and what is different. We also watched at Nadine Kaadan drawing Yazan and we followed her video to draw the character Yazan. The children created two pieces of art which were linked to the book.

Welcome back to the new half term.

It has already proved to be a really busy start to the term and the children have undertaken their learning with enthusiasm and positivity. On Wednesday, we recognised the work of The Refugee Crisis Foundation and dressed in blue to raise money and awareness of the plight of refugees. Linked to this, the children wrote some amazing poems linked to themes of being safe, comfort and protection. We also looked at Shamsia Hassani, a graffiti artist who campaigns on behalf of refugees and promotes positive messages through her artwork.

Over the next few weeks in English, we will be using The Arrival by Shaun Tan, a graphic novel which tells the story of an immigrant who arrives in a strange new land. The book will give us

lots of opportunities to develop our inference skills, along with building our writing skills in producing a narrative using a flashback.

In maths, our focus will be consolidating our calculation strategies, fractions and place value. We will also be looking at ratio and proportion and how numbers are scaled up and down.

Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.
