

If any of you are having a clear out and have any part rolls of wallpaper or backing paper that you no longer need we are happy to put it to good use in school.


We are very grateful for any donations to support the play of all children across school.


# This week we have been learning...

















Amazing Acorns



In Acorns this week we have been learning about the number two, how to write it and all the different ways you can represent it.

We have learning all about Autumn, we used our brilliant outdoor classroom for lots of different crafts activities and we collected autumn treasures on the field.

## **Brilliant Berries**

We have had another lovely week in Berries class. We have been continuing with the story The Three Little Pigs and this week we have been describing the Big Bad wolf. In phonics our sound of the week is 't'.

In science, we have been exploring everyday materials. We tested opaque materials to make curtains for the Little Pigs houses. We tested which materials float to make a boat to help the pigs escape from the wolf across the river. The Big Bad Wolf even came to our classroom to try and blow down the houses we made.

Awesome Ashes



This week in Ashes we have been learning all about the creation story and Harvest. We have been looking at the seven days of creation and made our own collages. We also talked about celebrating harvest and made our own harvest wreaths.

## Super Sycamores



This week in Sycamores the children have really worked hard on addition and subtraction using the whole, part, part method. They have found this model very useful for missing number problems too.

We have started our Geography unit on the UK and found Rawtenstall and London on a map of the UK.

In English we have used our senses to explore fruit and written amazing adjectives! This will culminate in an Autumn poem at the end of the half term.

In Forest School today, we have been learning how to use a compass to locate North, South, East and West.

## **Outstanding Alders**



In geography we have been learning about the UK, continents and oceans. We have enjoyed using the atlas to create a continents jigsaw and created our own continents map.

In science we have been exploring everyday materials and talking about their properties. We explored materials that are inside and outside and talked about why they are made for certain uses.

In English we wrote our own riddles and have really enjoyed sharing these with each other. Great work Alders. 🙂

## Enchanted Elms



Elms have been super scientist this week learning about different types of rocks. They tested different rocks for porosity, density and durability.

Just a reminder that Elms have Forest school next week on Tuesday 10th October 2023 - please ensure they have waterproofs and wellies.

## Marvellous Maples



In Science we have completed our egg experiment from last week. We have discovered that Cola, apple juice and Oasis are all acidic and will have an impact on our teeth. We have also learnt about the digestive system, how food moves through the body and where the important nutrients are absorbed. The children had great fun when this was done practically using crackers as the food, water as saliva, apple juice as the stomach acid and tights as the intestine.

## **Dazzling Elders**



Elders have worked very hard this week. In PE, they have been learning cricket skills and focusing on their bowling. In Maths, the Year four children have been learning about statistics and the Year five have been working on place value and number sequences involving decimals. The children have also been learning about local history and how to identify the age of buildings by the type of windows. In

English, the children have been identifying features of explanation texts and learning how to use causal conjunctions.

## Mighty Oaks




# St Paul's Choir
