Headteacher news





Attendance/Holiday information

Attendance to school is compulsory, all children must attend every day unless they are ill.

To enable us to safeguard our children, may we request that if your child is absent from school you, please telephone the school on 01706 215893 by 09:00am to inform us. If we have not received a call, a member of our office staff will call you to ensure that your child is at home and is safe.

What to do if my child is ill.

Despite school being cleaned daily using antibacterial solutions with the use of antibacterial soap and hand gels available for all to use freely. It is that time of year where Illness and viruses start to unfold.

 The NHS have a helpful guide should you wish to use this. <u>Is my child too ill for school? -</u> NHS (www.nhs.uk) • Please can you ensure that your child does not attend school for 48 hours after they have last vomited or had diarrhoea.

We are still encouraging good respiratory hygiene i.e. covering their nose/mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, discarding tissues after use and washing hands with soap and water. It is important to reduce the risk to others.

Can you authorise my child's absence?

As many of you are aware, we are unable to authorise any absences that are not illness related unless in exceptional circumstances. There is a 'leave of absence' form available from the school office however, we would ask that all holidays are taken within the holiday periods and not in term time, to avoid a fine from Lancashire County Council.

Earlier this week, I sent out our new holiday dates for the 2025-26 school year. These dates are crucial for planning purposes, and I kindly ask that you keep them in mind when considering any future family holidays or trips.

It's worth reiterating our school's policy on attendance during term time. As you're all aware, we place a high value on consistent attendance and its impact on our pupils' educational progress. With this in mind, I must remind you that leave during term time will not be authorised. This policy is in place to ensure that our pupils receive the full benefit of their education and don't miss out on valuable learning opportunities.

Should unauthorised leave be taken during term time, it's important to note that this will result in a penalty notice. This measure is not one we take lightly, but it's necessary to maintain the high standards of attendance that contribute to our pupils' success.

I understand that planning family time is important, and I hope that by providing these dates well in advance, we can work together to ensure that holidays and family commitments align with the school calendar wherever possible.

This week we have been learning...



Brilliant Berries

Berries have had a fabulous week, as always blowing our socks off. In maths, we have been using the part part whole model to partition numbers up to 100. The children have become masters, and all have the answer before I even get change to talk through it. Super work.

In English we have been writing captions for different parts of our story, 'Owl Babies'. The children have come up with some fantastic ideas and I am so proud of the work they were completing independently, they have made so much progress since September and some children are now even reading back their work to check that it makes sense, we are so proud. In Phonics, we have been looking at digraphs, oo (look) and oo (zoo), it confused us at first, but

they soon picked it up and were practising which sounds goes into each word, again making us very proud.

Of course, we have been continuing with all our own targets throughout the day and the children are making lots of progress towards these and this then supports the whole class work we are completing.

In topic, we have been creating artwork to match the seasons, we have used a range of printing skills to create different textures with our work. Their artwork looks fantastic.

On Monday we have PE and Wednesday our last Forest School session for the half term, please make sure they have a warm forest school kit in school.

Amazing Acorns



Another amazing week in Acorns, you have all been working so hard.

This week, we have been trying really hard in phonics. We have been learning the digraphs qu, ch and sh as well as tricky words: was and my. Ask your chid if they can remember how we make these. In English, we have been continuing with the story: Owl Babies. We made our own chocolate owl nest and then wrote instructions how to do this. We are now starting to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in our writing.

In maths we have been looking at how we partition different numbers using the part part whole models to help us. Ask your child how many different ways they can make the number 5. They have blown me away with how they have been continuing this independently in provision. I even spotted some children writing their own number sentences. Well done Acorns!

Awesome Ashes



Well done Ashes! A productive week in lots of ways. The children have been showing me the value of 'respect' this week, as we have been practicing and learning about this all half term. Lots of children are trying hard with their manners, their kindness and care for our classroom and each other.

In English we have been writing information about animals that live in Africa (this links with our work on Handa's Suprise). Children in Year 1 have been extending this by learning about Non Chronological Reports. We all hope to write some reports/sentences about the Great Fire of London next week!

In Maths, the children in Reception have been using their knowledge of their numbers to 10, and learning about the different ways to make 10-6+4, 5+5. Ask your child- can they make 10 in different ways? In Year 1, we have been counting in groups of 5, 10 and 2 and using this knowledge within our counting of coins. Can your child count groups of 2p, 5p or 10p coins? Next week we are working on doubles and simple multiplication.

In topic, we have been learning about how Christian's view God as a father. We read the story of 'The Prodigal Son' and thought about how God is seen by Christians as loving and forgiving.

We enjoyed Forest School today where the children went on a number hunt around the forest to link with our Number Day.

Curriculum News

In English, we have been writing our own information page all about rabbits. The children have used this as an opportunity to show off how fantastic their writing is and they have been using non-fiction features such as titles and bullet points.

Because of this, when we went to Forest School this week, we got Derek out so we could tell him everything we had learnt and check that he had everything he needed to survive.

In Maths we are back to addition and subtraction, but now we have to add more than 10 and take away more than ten, such as 52-16=. This has been quite tricky but the children have worked so hard and been very resilient.



Enchanted Elms



I am so proud of all the children this week. I know it was a wobbly week last week, but they have shown great perseverance. This week we have finished our guided reading book The Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitamura. The children have absolutely loved this book. It has taught us so much about the stone age. The children have written a book review for this just like you would in a bookstore or a library. In English the children have written a character description of Stig using noun phrases and we have been collecting a variety of language to help us write a setting description of the pit. In maths we have been looking at fractions of a number. E.g. 3/5 of 40. They have really grasped this concept and I'm so proud of them. In History the children have been learning about artefacts that have been left at Skara Brae and what that has taught us about who lived there. We have also looked at the Stonehenge and why it's so important to British history and wrote a fact file about it.

Dazzling Elders



It's been another busy and productive week in Elders class. In Maths, the Year fives have been using different methods for division and finding equivalent fractions. The Year fours have been mastering multiplication. In English, the children have been reading and performing poems by Benjamin Zephaniah and Brian Bilston about refugees. The children made lots of interesting observations about the poems. At forest school this week, the children had a fabulous but muddy time. The children had lots of imaginative play: creating dens, painting in mud, using the mud slide and climbing trees. In Science, the children have carried out four experiments to explore how sound travels through water, solids and air.

In topic, the children have been creating Anglo Saxon inspired crosses ready to construct from cardboard next week. They have also been learning in our History lessons: who the Anglo Saxons were, where they came from and the reasons they left their homes.

Mighty Oaks



As we edge closer and closer to the half term break, Oaks continue to work hard in all areas of the curriculum. Proud has been our thought this week in PSHCE - what can we be proud of in our everyday lives? This is a value that is recognised and seen in so many of our children with each and everyone of the class having completed something they are proud of this week.

Collating facts for writing can be a huge task but in English this week, the children have been using their creative minds to gather their ideas for writing about the Yellow-Spotted Lizard. Our

outcome is to produce a non-chronological report and the children are well underway in putting this together using many of the features of this text type. Their use of formal language and specific vocab has been fantastic to see and the children should be proud of the writing they are producing. In maths, we have been using negative numbers to identify difference and how these can be used in linear number sequences. Next week, our new topic is using co-ordinates to translate and reflect.

Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/free-school-meals/?page=3

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.
