# Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.

# **Attendance/Holiday information**

Attendance to school is compulsory, all children must attend every day unless they are ill.

To enable us to safeguard our children, may we request that if your child is absent from school you, please telephone the school on 01706 215893 by 09:00am to inform us. If we have not received a call, a member of our office staff will call you to ensure that your child is at home and is safe.

#### What to do if my child is ill.

Despite school being cleaned daily using antibacterial solutions with the use of antibacterial soap and hand gels available for all to use freely. It is that time of year where Illness and viruses start to unfold.

- The NHS have a helpful guide should you wish to use this. <u>Is my child too ill for school?</u> -NHS (www.nhs.uk)
- Please can you ensure that your child does not attend school for 48 hours after they have last vomited or had diarrhoea.

We are still encouraging good respiratory hygiene i.e. covering their nose/mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, discarding tissues after use and washing hands with soap and water. It is important to reduce the risk to others.

#### Can you authorise my child's absence?

As many of you are aware, we are unable to authorise any absences that are not illness related unless in exceptional circumstances. There is a 'leave of absence' form available from the school office however, we would ask that all holidays are taken within the holiday periods and not in term time, to avoid a fine from Lancashire County Council.

# Important Update – Changes to Education-related Penalty Notices from September 2024

Information for Parents



You may be aware that the Department for Education announced national changes to penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence in term time. These changes will come into effect on 19 August 2024.

The changes to be aware of are:

Please note that school does not receive any money for penalty notices.

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- A second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice **must** be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period[1]. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
- This also includes pupils with persistent absences.
- Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.

#### Absences can have a lasting effect on learning

Missing a week of school means your child will miss around 25 hours of learning This creates gaps in their knowledge and could mean they will not meet their full potential

[1] A school week is any week in which a school meets at least once.

**Amazing Acorns** 



Acorns have had another brilliant week; their resilience is really shining through, and they have all worked so hard throughout the week. It is really lovely to see their individual personalities growing and friendships developing.

In maths this week, we have been looking at the number 5. We have been practising counting to 5 and ordering numbers to five, as well as looking at 1 more and 1 less, we have even looked at 5-sided shape, the pentagon. Have a go at counting at home to 5 with your children, see if you can spot the numeral 5 in your local area or practise counting whilst out and about.

In English, we have been reading the story 'Oliver's vegetables', we have been thinking about fruit and vegetables that we do and do not like and having a go at writing their names. We have been using pictures from the story to order the days of the week, which links with maths and to also re tell the story all by ourselves.

Our topic this week has been all about Guy Fawkes and who he is. Ask your children about facts of Guy Fawkes and bonfire night. We have also created some beautiful art work in the style of fireworks using a range of materials and resources.

#### Awesome Ashes



#### Marvellous Maples



In English this week, Maples have read a short novel called 'The treasure of the loch ness monster'. First, we made predictions using the images and then read the book. We have started to create character profiles for both the characters and thought about what traits they have. The children have also written a diary entry as one of the characters using some of the vocabulary we have collected.

In maths, the year 4 children have been learning about factors and how to multiply a number by 10 and 100. They have worked really hard at this and have really progressed. The Year 3 children have been mastering their times tables and looking at using these to help when identifying missing numbers in number sequences.

The children were real life historians in our history lesson, this week. The children were given a picture of life in the ancient Egyptian times. The children were given the task of using their knowledge of Ancient Egypt to find the historical inaccuracies. I was blown away at how many children were able to find the suitable inaccuracies. We have some fantastic historians in Maples class.
