Apply for support for with childcare costs.



From 2 January 2024, eligible working parents can apply for 15 hours of childcare for their two-year-old. Parents have until 31 March 2024 to apply for a code, with mid-January to the end of February being the optimum time to apply in case they need to provide further information to support their application.

To apply for a childcare code each parent needs to be working and earning the equivalent of 16 hours a week at national minimum/living wage and under £100,000 adjusted net income per year. This means that each parent needs to earn from just over £8,600 per year to be eligible for 15 hours a week of childcare during term time.

There is more information on the childcare support available to parents on the <u>Childcare Choices</u> website, where they can explore the early education entitlements and other government help with childcare costs.

Have your circumstances changed? Apply for free school meals.



1 - Have your circumstances changed?

For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.

February Disco Thursday 8th February 2024

Dear parents / carers

The 2024 February Disco is held at school on **Thursday 8**th **February**.

The doors open for all children at **6.00pm** and **ALL** children need to be collected from school **by 8.00pm** by a responsible adult.

Please note that only children that currently attend St. Paul's are allowed in the Disco. We realise this may cause inconvenience for some parents with younger children, however it is a rule for the safety of our children.

The price is £2 per child. If you wish to stay with your child at the Disco, then the cost per adult is £2.00. Please note that adults do not need to stay as the children will be supervised by staff and PTA volunteers. Adults who stay cannot use their mobile phones during the disco. This is a strict rule for safeguarding reasons. We will have to ask you to leave if this rule is ignored.

A list of volunteers will be made prior to the disco and volunteers should arrive at 5.45pm and entrance is free. Please leave your name at the school reception or contact the PTA through the Facebook page. We will not be accepting volunteers on the night.

As well as the Disco, where the children can boogie in their best dresses or party pants, there are other activities such as lucky dip, crafts and games. Refreshments in the form of hot dogs are available to buy plus juice, water, crisps and sweets. Face painting and temporary tattoos are also available on the night. Please note the tattoos are easily removed with baby oil. Prices range from 20p to £1.00, and all stall holders are happy to help children who are not confident with money.

The children have a wonderful time and grow in confidence with each school Disco, however if you have any concerns please seek out a member of the PTA or ask at reception.

No mobile phones or any electronic recording devices are allowed at the disco (children or adults) for the safety of all the children.

• Please can you ensure that any uniform or bottles that are brought into school are labelled with your child's name on as we have had quite a few jumpers and bottles going missing.


Super Sycamores

Marvellous Maples



We have reached the half term so quickly and Maples have kept focusing on their learning and have been busy. In Maths, the Year 4s have been learning about hundredths and linking this to pound and pence. Year 3s have been learning about division through repeated subtraction in the first step towards understanding chunking. In English we have written our own independent story - a sequel to The Boy Who Grew Dragons. The children have loved this story, and we are going to read the next book, The Boy Who Lived With Dragons as our class reader at the end of each day. Please note the correct date for the next Forest school is Friday 23rd February and PE remains on Monday (indoor) and Tuesday (outdoor) after the half term.

Dazzling Elders



In History this week, we have looked at where Anglo-Saxon cemeteries have been found and how local place names are derived from Anglo Saxon words. In our science lessons, the children have been learning about food webs and created a food web for the plants and animals in the Arctic eco system. The children been reading poetry and writing their own similes and metaphors. They really enjoyed reading "The Slithermonchowchuck" by Aoife Mannix.
