Back to school preparation for September

Parking

The vast majority of pupils at St Pauls and Alder Grange arrive on foot to school, however there are still a significant number of pupils who are dropped off - in private cars and taxis. Having so many pupils arriving at the same time, an increased amount of cars on the road means we do need to enforce the

use of the one way system around the school complexes at critical times. This is especially relevant in the morning.

It is not acceptable to park in the bus stop area, disabled bays, staff parking areas, in front of neighbours driveways or on the double yellow lines around school - this poses a significant risk of harm to our children

The schools have always asked parents to follow the one way system around the complex, and not to use the roundabout access at peak times. This will add a small amount of time to your journey, which we feel is acceptable to ensure we keep our pupils as safe as possible. There have been too many near misses where drivers have come too close to pupils and parents on and around the crossing and roundabout for us to allow the practice to continue.

Neither schools will put up with abuse directed at any member of staff going about their duty, and giving up their time to support our pupils. We will report, to the police, all incidents of abuse and of illegal parking. We are working with the local council to request more traffic calming measures and parking enforcement, and hope to see wardens out each week.

We hope that you will continue to support us, and we are really grateful for the many positive messages we have received - which shows that if all cars use the one way system traffic flows much better.

Lunchtime & snack reminders from September

Friendly reminder for parents when packing snacks and lunches. We have pupils with severe airborne allergies in school, therefore please can you ensure that you only pack food **without Sesame**, **nuts and citrus** to enable us to keep children safe and healthy. Please note that staff will remove any items of food or drinks that contain these ingredient's in order to safeguard children and staff.

All children are encouraged to bring a bottle of water with their name marked on the bottle filled with water. Children have access to refilling their water bottle at key times of the day to ensure they are hydrated. Should you wish to buy a school water bottle please pay on ParentPay and then collect the bottle from the school office.

We also provide toast as a morning snack at a cost of 20p per day. This is paid for each half term in advance. So please ensure you pay on ParentPay within the given deadlines. (Reminders are sent via email).

Change of details

Please can all parents inform us of any changes to mobile numbers, email addresses, home address and in addition make the changes on your ParentPay account. We cannot access your account to update this for you.

School Meals

The weekly cost of school meals as of September 1st has increased to £13.50 per week (£2.70 a day). Payment is due weekly in advance via ParentPay. **

School meal information for parents of children in EYFS & KS1. (Berries, Acorns, Ashes, Sycamores and Alders)

Your child is eligible for Universal Free School Meals, which means that your child will get a free school dinner everyday. Although this is great news for you, please could we ask that all parents who are entitled to any of the <u>qualifying benefits</u> that you apply using the following link as that provides us with an essential funding stream called pupil premium. We are able to utilise these funds to support your child's education whilst at St. Paul's, this could be used for additional learning support and providing extra-curricular activities. Please apply here.

School meal information for parents of children in Years 3-6.

If your child has moved up to Year 3 this week, **they will no longer be eligible for 'Universal' Free School Meals** unless you are eligible for free school meals.

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium. We are able to utilise these funds to support your child's education whilst at St. Paul's, this could be used for additional learning support and providing extra-curricular activities.

For any parents/carers, **whose circumstances have changed** and think their child(ren) may be entitled to Free School Meals, please can an application form be completed. Parents can apply electronically via the link below:

Registering for the Free School Meal service also means the school will receive additional funding for your child, which is called Pupil Premium.

Please note that younger siblings of pupils who are already entitled will not automatically qualify for Free School Meals. If a family's circumstances have changed and cease to be entitled to qualifying benefits, the elder children will be protected but any new children will not qualify. This is why Pupil Access Team require applications completing so they can properly assess new sibling's entitlement.



Attendance/Holiday information

Attendance to school is compulsory, all children must attend every day unless they are ill.

As many of you are aware, we are unable to authorise any absences that are not illness related unless in exceptional circumstances. There is a 'leave of absence' form available from the school office however,

we would ask that all holidays are taken within the holiday periods and not in term time, to avoid a fine from Lancashire County Council.

To enable us to safeguard our children, may we request that if your child is absent from school you, please telephone the school on 01706 215893 by 09:00am to inform us. If we have not received a call, a member of our office staff will call you to ensure that your child is at home and is safe.

Important Update – Changes to Education-related Penalty Notices from September 2024

Information for Parents

You may be aware that the **Department for Education** has recently announced national changes to penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence in term time. These changes will come into effect on 19 August 2024.

The changes to be aware of are:

Please note that school does not receive any money for penalty notices.

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice **must** be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period[1]. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
- Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.

Absences can have a lasting effect on learning

Missing a week of school means your child will miss around 25 hours of learning This creates gaps in their knowledge and could mean they will not meet their full potential

[1] A school week is any week in which a school meets at least once.
