

English

This half term we will be looking at Shakespeare's Macbeth and to write a balanced argument identifying whether he was a tragic hero or a dastardly villain. We will also be looking at classical narrative poetry, using The Highway Man as the focus. Spelling homework will be supported by The Spelling Shed and ten spellings a week will be given for the children to learn. Children are also expected to read for at least 15 minutes each day and this reading is to be recorded in their diaries.

Maths

Maths lessons will focus on revision of key facts from all of key stage two in preparation for the end of key stage two assessments in May. Mental arithmetic, written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division as well as reasoning problems will be reinforced through daily lessons. We will also be looking at measurement, shape, algebra and statistics.

The unit this term will cover Being my Best. As a class, we will begin to look at goals and aspirations and how we can prepare for our future. As part of this unit, we will also begin discussing the transition to high school.
