Daily expectations:

- TT Rockstars - this is set so your child can improve their fluency in all the times tables.
 - Spelling Shed - new spellings have been set for the next half term.
 - Reading for at least 20 minutes per day
 - Purple Mash - additional activities linked to the curriculum have been set. Please encourage your child to check regularly
- Over the coming weeks, we will be using units of work produced by Lancashire to support your child's reading and writing skills at home. These provide daily activities linked to different themes - the first one being Magic - something I am sure will engage all the children! All the resources are accessible by clicking on the related links on the planning unit.
I hope that your children enjoy the units of work and I look forward to hearing how you got on.
