Comic Relief

In 1985, Richard Curtis, Jane Tewson and friends came up with the idea to use comedy to make the public laugh, whilst raising money for people in Africa and the UK. The first ever Red Nose Day was held in 1988 and raised over £15 million.

As well as raising money, Comic Relief also helps to raise awareness such as telling people about the world's 17 Global Goals to end extreme poverty, fight inequality and injustice and halt climate change.
