

Return to School in September 2020

Does my child have to attend school in September?

Yes, from Wednesday 2nd September all children **must** return to school (except Reception children).

How will you keep my child safe?

We will be putting measures with some details below to keep our community as safe as possible. We cannot guarantee that your child will not become unwell at any time.

What will my child wear?

Full school uniform including school shoes must be worn each day. **Trainers or shoes resembling trainers are not part of our everyday uniform and should only be on a PE day whilst in the pandemic situation.**

Children must bring a coat. Bags or other items **must not** be brought between school and home.

Can I call into the school office to drop something off or meet my child's teacher?

No, the site is closed except for essential contractors and maintenance that are/is pre-arranged. Please call or email us on school@constablelee.lancs.sch.uk.

You will need:

A piece of fruit for snack (KS2). **No citrus or nuts.** Fruit will be provided in KS1. Toast will not be provided.

To come in a suitable outdoor PE kit on their PE day.

All children will need plenty of water in a labelled bottle. These will go home everyday.

If you do not pre-order a school meal, you will need to bring a packed lunch in their usual packed lunch bag and bring your own spoon if needed.

Other information:

The staff car park as normal is **closed.** Parents and Carers are not to park in there. Please only use the disabled spaces if you have a blue badge.

Start and end times will be staggered. See the following page.

All children must arrive and be collected on time at their own class door.

EYFS, KS1, Transition unit and Upper KS2 will form their own bubbles. As far as possible, these bubbles will not mix.

Staggered Times

- We would encourage you to walk to school. If you do arrive by car please avoid using the ring road as much as possible.
- Please follow the one way system marked around our school paths.
- Please avoid standing near other families and use the blue dots on the playground and paths to distance yourself from others.
- Keep your children close to you.
- Please do not let your children play with the equipment outside that has been setup for learning by staff.
- Please arrive at the designated time.
- At collection time please ensure you leave the playground straight away as both playgrounds will be used for BYT.

Other FAQs

- Children will be in their class groups. We will have 4 Key Stage bubbles who will arrive at school together, have playtime, lunchtime, go home at the same time and if in BYT will be given a place in the same BYT bubble. Guidance states that children within the bubble may not be able to distance socially. Adults will distance from children as much as possible.
- **Will my child need their PE kit?**
- Your child will be told which day they have outdoor PE and forest school. On PE days your child should come dressed for outdoor PE (Sportswear & trainers).
- **Will my child need their book bag?**
- No, reading books will be sent home on a Monday in a zip wallet. They will need to be returned on Thursday morning in the zip wallet.
- **My child has medication. How do I arrange for this to be taken in school time?**
- If medication is required, please email school@constablelee.lancs.sch.uk to request a medical form. We will send this home with your child. Or alternatively download the form below. Please complete it and return with your child's medication. We will only give medication to children with completed forms.
- **Should I keep my forest kit in school?**
- No, you will need to bring your child's forest kit in a plastic carrier bag on the day of Forest school. You will need to hang it up in the school garage on arrival and the children will go home in their forest kit with their uniform in their plastic bag. Children's wellies can be kept in school.
- **What will my child have for snack?**
- We cannot yet handle money for toast; therefore we recommend that children bring a healthy snack – **No citrus fruits or nuts please**
- **Will my child eat in the hall with lots of other children?**
- No, your child will eat in their classroom. The classroom tables will be cleaned both before and after lunch.
- **What will happen if my child needs the toilet?**
- They will be escorted to the toilet area by a member of staff who will wait in the corridor to ensure that no one else goes into the toilet area at the same time.
- **Will my child be moving around school?**
- No, only to go to the bathroom. All classrooms have direct access to outside spaces and will only move between their bubble including BYT children.

School response if a child displays symptoms during school time.

Concern raised by the child themselves or by an adult supervising.

Person is isolated immediately. With a member of staff close by. Child's parents will be contacted.

Child **must** be collected **immediately** from school.

Mandatory 7 days of self-isolation.

Negative Test Result:

You do not need to self-isolate if your test is negative, as long as:
Everyone you live with who has symptoms tests negative
everyone in your support bubble who has symptoms tests negative.
Or you were not told to self-isolate for 14 days by NHS Test and Trace – if you were, see [what to do if you've been told you've been in contact with someone who has coronavirus](#)
you feel well – if you feel unwell, stay at home until you're feeling better
If you have diarrhoea or you're being sick, stay at home until 48 hours after they've stopped.

What if my child displays symptoms at home?

Isolate your child where possible.

Do not allow your child to attend school or other public places.

Mandatory 7 days of self-isolation.

Inform school if your child is displaying symptoms.

Negative Test Result:

The child must complete the compulsory 7 days self-isolation.

The rest of the bubble can return to school as usual.

Parents **MUST** inform school of test outcome **immediately**.

Test **MUST** be arranged and **must** take place.

All families must engage with the Test and Trace process.

What if I am contacted by NHS Test and Trace?

Follow all instructions from the NHS Test and Trace advisor

If any member of your family living within your household displays any symptoms, please follow the NHS guidance by calling 119

Inform school immediately.
Do not bring your child into school.

If you are contacted on a weekend, inform school **by 9am** on the Monday morning. Your child will be unable to return until we have seen a negative result following your test.
