The Easter Story

Palm Leaves: Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey to celebrate Passover. As he arrived people covered the path with palm leaves and shouted 'Hosanna' and 'Jesus is the King'.

Priests: Some of the priests were very jealous of Jesus. They did not like how liked he was by ordinary people. One of Jesus' disciples, called Judas, went to the priests and said he would betray Jesus for silver.

Last Supper: Jesus sat for a meal with his 12 disciples where he was sad and told them he would be going away to be with his Father in heaven. The disciples said they would not let Jesus come to any harm but Jesus said he knew one would betray him for money. Judas stood up and left.

Bread and Wine: Jesus told his disciples that he would be arrested and nailed to a cross and explained that some people in Jerusalem did not like him. To enable them to remember him, Jesus broke some bread and said 'This is my body. Take it and eat it and remember me'. Next he took his cup of wine told them it was his blood and to drink it to remember him.

Garden of Gethsemane: Jesus and his disciples went to the garden of Gethsemane. Jesus was very sad and he asked Peter and Paul to watch over him whilst he prayed. Jesus asked his Father to take away his suffering but he also prayed, 'not my will, however, but your will be done' and Jesus was strengthened.
