English activity ideas based on Taking Flight

Activity 1: Write a character description.

Watch the video Taking Flight on <https://vimeo.com/182555047>

It's about a boy going to his Nonno's house.

Draw a picture of the boy's *Nonno* and label it as a plan for your writing. Write a character description of Nonno. Use expanded noun phrases, similes and powerful adjectives to describe Nonno. Remember to include complex sentences and relative clauses.

Activity 2: Plan an adventure story

Plan a story about a child and their "adventures" Choose how you want to plan the story as a story map or story mountain? Use ideas from the film clip for inspiration. Think about each part of the story. What does an interesting story need to include?

Activity 3: Write an adventure story.

Write your story using your plan, make sure you use paragraphs. Include detail and create suspense. Try to vary your sentences. How could you make your story exciting? What features have we used to create suspense?

Activity 4/5: Complete your adventure story and edit and improve it.

Use a dictionary or thesaurus to check and improve your writing (there are online ones if you haven't one at home). If your adult can email it to school I would love to read your story. When it is complete you can illustrate it as well and create a front cover and blurb.

Remember don't rush your writing or your planning it takes time. Think about how long we take when we are in class. Nothing is perfect the first time go back and check your work. Read each sentence out loud and make sure it makes sense. Have you missed out any words or punctuation? Don't forget those pesky full stops and capital letters for names of people and places etc.
